
Annual Report 2024

Playgroup Tasmania continued to grow during 2023-24, expanding our impact across the state.

The result is even more families benefiting from our supported, specialised and community-led programs.

Building partnerships continues to be an important component of our work. This includes partnerships with decision makers, government agencies and collaborations with a range of like-minded organisations. We also continued to develop on-the-ground links with local services that directly benefit families' health and wellbeing and support child development.

In late 2023, Tasmania celebrated 50 years of playgroups in our state. We held a formal celebration with then Minister for Community Services The Hon Jo Palmer sharing some of her own playgroup experiences with us.

As part of 50th birthday celebrations, we were delighted to have community members of all ages share their favourite playgroup memories with us. It was a testament to the lifelong positive impacts these grassroots groups contribute to our state.

The extensive renovation of our Holbrook Street headquarters in Launceston was completed in late 2023. The brightly coloured, sunny spaces have already hosted hundreds of families during playgroup sessions. The works were undertaken with support from the State and Federal governments.

Playgroups are an essential part of our communities and a vital contributor to both child development and family wellbeing. As the peak body for playgroups in Tasmania, we continue to be proud of the work done by the Playgroup team, our volunteer board members, playgroup leaders and community volunteers who tirelessly support families to flourish in our state.
