## Getting families off to a great start

Baby Villages are place-based, people-centred community playgroups for families with children who aren't yet walking. Led by volunteers, Baby Village activities and outcomes are core to the Tasmanian Child and Youth Wellbeing Strategy's priority actions.

Baby Village volunteer leaders receive induction, training and ongoing support from Playgroup Tasmania with the emphasis on providing baby focused, friendly and welcoming spaces for all who attend. Secure and happy babies, parental wellbeing and linking people to appropriate services and supports are also vital components of these playgroups.

Baby Village playgroups were debuted in communities that identified a specific need in their area. Already, more than 130 families have attended Baby Villages in Howrah, New Town and Dodges Ferry and more locations are being planned in direct response to community demand. Specialised activity resources support volunteer leaders to link play with developmental outcomes.

# Child safe, child friendly

Playgroup Tasmania took a consultative, co-design approach to developing a fit-for-purpose child safety framework, which was introduced throughout the playgroup community in early 2023.

Sitting at the heart of this framework is the voice of playgroup children who expressed what makes them 'feel safe' through both artworks and words. We continue to listen to their voices and to respond to what we hear.

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Playgroup Tasmania's Statement of Commitment to Child Safety & Wellbeing and the related Code of Conduct, policies and procedures are now embedded throughout staff and volunteer induction and training and promoted widely.

In addition to our Community Playgroup support and Baby Village playgroups, we continue to deliver a range of specialised programs to support early linkages to child development support and services.

Our very popular Play and Supported Learning (PALS) playgroups provide physical and social development opportunities for children of all abilities. This is done through music, nature and circus play and other activities in partnership with local cultural, arts and sport and recreation providers.

PlayConnect+ playgroups are also busy providing supported play for families with children from birth to 6 years who have a disability or developmental concerns. Each of these groups provides valuable connections with local families as well as information and referrals to relevant services.

The PlayTogether training program is now supplemented by our online **Playgroup Tasmania Resource Hub**. The Hub is simple to use and includes ideas to make your playgroup inclusive along with a growing library of information, ideas and templates to support our volunteer leaders.
